On the day of your evaluation, specialized testing will be performed to diagnose the root cause of the signs and symptoms, and a personalized treatment plan will be discussed based on the results of your findings.

Please follow the instructions below for the most accurate test results on the day of your evaluation.

- ✓ Do not use any lubricating drops on the day of your evaluation.
- ✓ Do not use any prescription eye drops within two hours of your appointment. (i.e., Glaucoma drops)
- ✓ Do not use ointments or gels in or around your eyes the night before your appointment.
- ✓ Do not wear your Contact Lenses on the day of your evaluation. They may be inserted after your testing is complete.
- ✓ Please do not wear any eye makeup before your appointment.
- ✓ Do not use oily cleansers or oily makeup removers the night before your appointment.
- ✓ Do not apply facial lotions, eye creams, or makeup before your appointment.

Plan for a minimum of 1 hour for the medical ocular surface evaluation appointment. Your eyes will not be dilated.

The Medical visits will be submitted to your medical insurance:

- The medical portion of your exam will be submitted to your medical insurance, and your copay will be collected on the day of the Ocular Surface Disease Evaluation.
- If you have not met your deductible, you will be responsible for the medical evaluation on the day of your medical office visit.
- Any visits scheduled with the doctor will also be submitted to your medical insurance, and your copay will be collected if your deductible has been met.
